Overall Purpose of the Job and its Primary Objectives

Downright Special supports children with Down syndrome in all aspects of their care, education and development. The majority of children with Down syndrome attend mainstream nurseries and primary schools and Downright Special works to ensure these children are successfully included in the classroom by providing early intervention groups, training, and outreach visits. We also provide some support to Special Schools. The Specialist Teacher is responsible for delivering an education intervention programme to children with Down syndrome within small groups. Children attend these sessions with their teaching assistants from school and everything is tailored to the specific learning profile of children with Down syndrome. The Specialist Teacher provides resources for the Teaching Assistants to take back into school to help with differentiating the curriculum. The role also involves some outreach work in schools such as attending Annual Reviews and occasionally providing support on request for specific issues. The Specialist Teacher will also be expected to support the delivery of training courses. The focus of this role is to support children in Key Stage 1 but may also involve working with children in Foundation Stage.

Key Relationships

- Work directly educating children with special educational needs
- Work in partnership with parents
- Work with teachers, teaching assistants, SENCOs and other school support staff
- Report directly to Downright Special's Charity Manager.
- Work as a member of the Downright Special team and meet together on a regular basis for support and supervision.
- Liaise with other supporting professionals, e.g. Speech Therapists.
- Work closely with volunteers supporting the Charity.

Key Responsibilities and Duties

- To deliver small group sessions tailored to the specific learning profile of children with Down syndrome
- To be responsible for the implementation and development of all sessions e.g. designing/making resources

- To prepare, set up and tidy away for each of the sessions ensuring appropriate and well-maintained education resources are available.
- To regularly monitor and report on each child's progress.
- To contribute to the formation of Education and Health Care Plans (EHCP).
- Attend Annual Review meetings in schools and to advise and liaise with schools in the development of Individual Education Plans (IEP) or equivalent
- Where required give outreach support to schools on inclusion of a child with Down syndrome in a mainstream primary school setting including differentiating the curriculum, behaviour, social and emotional development, speech, language and communication, the use of sign language.
- Provide input to planning key transition stages such as Foundation Stage to KS1 or KS1 to KS2
- To liaise with other agencies concerned with the support of the child.
- Support delivery of training related to the education of children with Down syndrome
- To liaise with, signpost and refer to other services which may be of benefit to the child and family
- To keep abreast of the latest research, news and training on the education and development of children with Down syndrome.
- To be familiar with Downright Special policies and procedures e.g. safeguarding, health and safety, confidentiality, Data Protection etc.
- To attend any appropriate meetings which are relevant to children on their caseload subject to the agreement of Downright Special
