Who we are:

Downright Special is a charity supporting children with Down Syndrome in Hull and the East Riding of Yorkshire. We assist and support families and professionals in all aspects of the care and education of children with the condition. We help families feel less isolated and alone, we change expectations of what people with Down Syndrome can achieve when the right support is in place and improve the education and health outcomes for people with Down Syndrome.

Originally started in 2007 by a group of parents, we set out to provide support to each other and any other parents who had children with Down Syndrome. This quickly developed into an organised group giving emotional, practical and educational support to families. Downright Special has been a registered charity since 2009 and is run by a small team of professionally trained volunteers and staff.

What we do:

We offer a range of services for children from birth and onwards throughout their school years. We do this through:

- Visits to new parents or parents with an antenatal diagnosis.
- A weekly fun and education session (Downright Special Fridays), providing education, fun and play as well as support to parents and carers.
- A sensory and signing group for babies.
- Social events for the whole family.
- Lending useful resources to parents.
- Sharing best practice teaching techniques with teaching assistants.
- Specialist resource packs for children starting school.
- Conferences and training for parents and professionals.
- Working closely with local health and education services to improve the care pathway and educational outcomes for our children.
- Promoting the awareness of Down Syndrome and encouraging successful inclusion.

Everything we do is based on years of research by experts and we are led and supported by parents who have children with Down Syndrome and therefore, the needs of children and families are central.

Our aim is simple: to build a brighter future for children with Down Syndrome, supporting them to achieve their full potential and promoting successful inclusion in all aspects of life.

Why we need you!

To continue offering our services and support across the region we need your help to make it possible.

£3.00 pays for one of our DVDs 'Great Expectations' which is given to new parents who are just coming to terms with the news.

£5.00 pays for one new parent information pack.

£60.00 will provide a resource box to support a child in nursery.

£70.00 pays for one pack given to a new parent at our group that includes signing books and DVDs.

£140 will provide a resource box to support a child in a mainstream school.

£200 will support one child with school visits for one term.

£400 will pay for a soft play session where the children can mix with their peers and parents can spend time advising and supporting each other.

£500 would pay for one Downright Special Friday. Each Friday session supports 30 children with Down Syndrome and 12 Teaching Assistants. These sessions provide education built around the specific learning profile of children with Down Syndrome, covering all aspects of their development including speech and language, literacy, numeracy, gross and fine motor skills.

£1000 to keep our phone lines, website and social media running for a year.

 Donations are taken before tax, which means the charity gets more of your donation and it costs you less. It also means we don't have to claim Gift Aid, so there's less admin for us. You can give to any organisation recognised as charitable by HMRC.

Fundraising Tips

- Decide on an event or activity and register the event with fundraising@downrightspecial.co.uk. Please feel free to ask if you need any other information to help you with the day. We can provide leaflets about Down Syndrome, information about Downright Special, collection tins, buckets, posters, balloons etc, if you would find that useful.
- 2 Find fun ways to fundraise, such as sponsors, raffles and games. Ask companies to donate prizes.
- Look to see if your company operates a scheme called Matched Giving. This is an easy way to double your money.
- 4 Set up an online fundraising page with JustGiving by searching for Downright Special.
- 5 Encourage your sponsors who are tax payers to Gift Aid their donations. You can do this by asking them to fill in a simple form or ticking a box on a sponsor form.
- 6 Consider promotion! Use social media.
- 7 Remember Health and Safety. Some events may require a risk assessment.
- 8 Do you need a licence? Check with the local authority if your event needs a special licence such as an alcohol or gambling licence.







What to Say / What Not to Say

(Info Downloaded from the Down's Syndrome Association)



Don't say	Do say
Suffers from OR is a victim of Down syndrome	Has Down syndrome
A Down's baby/person/child	A person/baby/child with Down's syndrome or who has Down syndrome
Retarded/mentally handicapped/backward/mental disability	Learning disability
Disease/illness/handicap	Condition OR genetic condition
The risk of a baby having Down syndrome (in relation to pre-natal screening and probability assessments)	The chance of a baby having Down syndrome

Myths	Facts
People with Down's syndrome don't live very long.	Today, people with Down's syndrome are living into their 50s and 60s with a small number living into their 70s and beyond
Only older mothers have babies with Down's syndrome.	Although older mothers have a higher individual chance of having a baby with Down's syndrome, more are born to younger mothers, reflecting the higher birth rate in this group.
People with Down's syndrome cannot achieve normal life goals.	With the right support, they can. Small but increasing numbers of people with Down's syndrome are leaving home and living with support in their communities. They are, gaining employment, meeting partners and getting the best out of life.
People with Down's syndrome all look the same.	There are certain physical characteristics that can occur. Each person will have a number of the more common physical characteristics. A person with Down's syndrome will always look more like his or her close family than someone else with the condition
People with Down's syndrome are always happy and affectionate.	We are all individuals and people with Down's syndrome are no different to anyone else in their character traits and varying moods.
